Shri Lakhiram Das grows Boro rice on his 15 bighas land in his village of Dakhin Dharmatul of Morigaon district. While his fields yield a good 800 kgs of rice per bigha, bringing water from the nearby ponds into the fields, one bucket at a time, was a tedious, time consuming & more importantly, a back-breaking task. He had to pay people to bring in water, and even bought water by the tanker, burning a hole in his pocket. The implementation of the PMKSY-HKPP Scheme in his district saw the setting up of many a Solar & Electric TubeWell in his village, including a Solar powered one on his farmland. Walking in his fields, Shri Das says, "I'm grateful for this Solar Tube Well. It has saved me so much time & effort. I'm actually saving money on irrigation & electricity bills. And while I'm yet to harvest this season's crop, I'm expecting a yield will be at least 1000 kgs this time, thanks to the improved irrigation."

"The small farmer works much harder than his more affluent brethren. We can't afford costly machines, so we have to make do with the sweat of our brows & the strength of our backs," says Bhuvan Das in a matter-of-fact way. He owns a small farm of 2 bighas in Manipur village of Morigaon district where he grows rice. "I've been in agriculture for a long time but it's only recently I'm seeing that the small farmers are being benefited by government schemes," says Shri Das. "Take this Solar TubeWell that I got under the PMKSY-HKPP Scheme for example. Now I don't have to spend time hauling water from the pond or praying for proper rains, and with proper irrigation, my yield has gone up by around 200 kgs per bigha. Even we can dream now."

With the installation of the electrical pump, Sanikapur's farm land produces around 600-700 kg of rice and other vegetables per bigha. He earns a good profit from his agri business today and his family prospering. He is thankful to the government and Honourable Prime Minister Modi for the initiative taken to uplift farmers.

Abhir Ghatowal of village Mukharghar, Biswanath has solar tube well installed in his farm land under PMKSY scheme. He cultivates Boro Rice and produces around 2 quintal of rice per bigha. Total produce he get from his 20 bighas of land is around 4 tonne of rice .

Abhir had faced several challenges in the past including water scarcity and manpower cost. There was not proper facilities for irrigation and dependant on rainwater only. During the drought period he suffered huge loses. Today his life has become joyous and farming easy for Abhir with the introduction of PMKSY scheme in his village. Cost of production also decreases thereby increasing his income. After adopting the PMKSY scheme, Abhir started earning a decent income and all his challenges relating to shortage of water and extra expenses swept away.
